RE: AB 1435 (Nguyen) – Business Clean Up Relief Act of 2025 – SUPPORT

Dear Assemblymember Mike Gibson,

The above organizations support **AB 1435 (Nguyen)**, which provides financial relief to businesses facing the ongoing costs of cleaning up unauthorized encampments and illegal dumping. The Supreme Court's decision in *City of Grants Pass v. Johnson* has allowed cities to enforce no-camping ordinances, leading to a rise in encampments on private commercial properties. Business owners, particularly small businesses operating on tight margins, are now forced to bear the escalating costs of waste removal, property repairs, and security.

AB 1435 establishes a five-year tax credit to help offset these financial burdens, ensuring that businesses can remain open, safe, and economically viable. This legislation will help revitalize key commercial areas, reduce blight, and support businesses that are essential to California's local economies. By alleviating the financial pressures placed on property and business owners, AB 1435 promotes investment, economic stability, and community well-being.
